

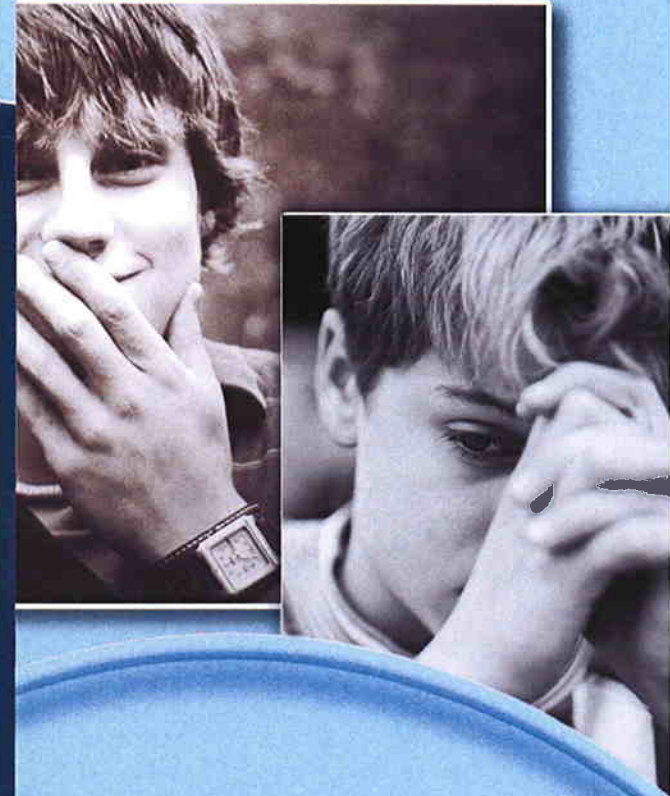

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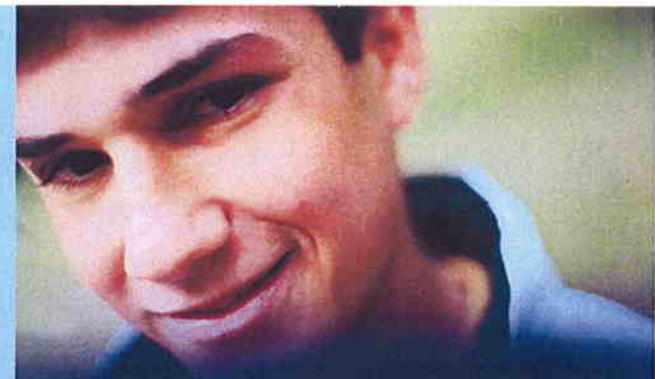
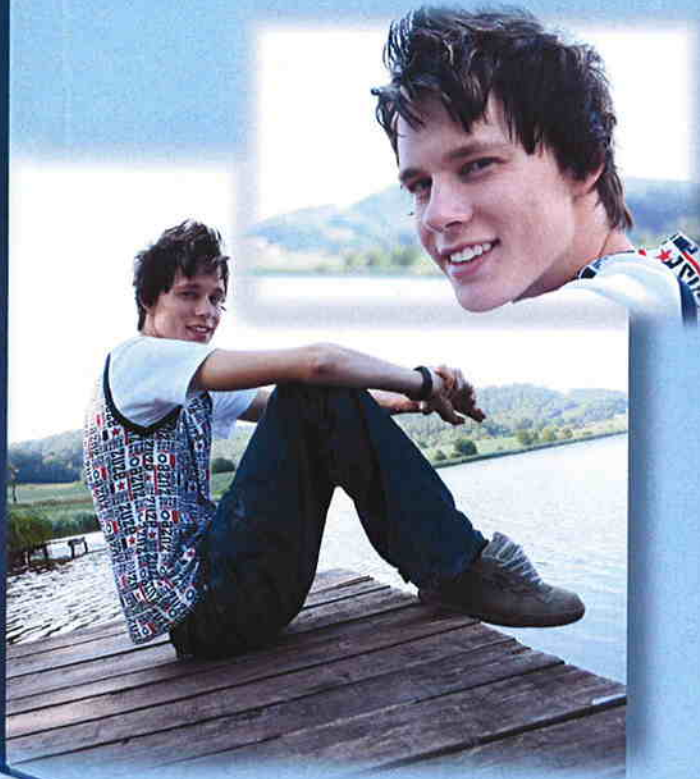

Our Philosophy

At The Children's Center of Ohio, we believe that each young person who has had problems in the past deserves the chance to use their potential and ability to make positive changes in their behaviors.

To this end, each component of our program is designed to give each young person individualized opportunities to make positive improvements. Our program is designed to help young people recognize, analyze, and change attitudes and behaviors that led to placement in our program. The treatment program at The Children's Center of Ohio consists of five parts that make up the life experience: work, education, recreation, voluntary religious services, and individual and group counseling.

The program is designed for, but not limited to a six to 12 month residency. After working through our phase system, a child earns graduation. Graduation from the program is based on meeting well defined treatment objectives and completion of the Individualized Treatment Plan.



The curriculum consists of group counseling which focuses on behaviors and issues such as aggression, moral development, relationships and appropriate social interaction with others. This includes but is not limited to basic sex education, positive peer interaction, family functioning, and drug and alcohol education.

Along with group sessions, youth also receive individual counseling. This counseling is tailored toward each child's treatment goals, and provides a plan for ultimate success.
